Can you draw and write about your favourite character from the book?</p>	<p>Go into your garden or a park near your house and collect some sticks, pebbles and leaves. See what 2D shapes you can make using them. Which shapes are easiest to make using the sticks? Which objects were the best for making a circle? Maybe you could use your shapes to play 'Guess the Shape' with a family member. Describe the shape, remembering to say how many corners and sides it has e.g. "It has 4 corners. It has 4 straight sides. Its 4 sides are equal." See who can guess the most shapes</p>
