Stand them up and put them in order from the shortest to the tallest. Is the biggest one in the line up the biggest toy you own? How big is the biggest toy you own? What could you use to measure it?</p> <p>How tall are your other toys?</p> <p>If you want a challenge you could even order your family members for the shortest to the tallest? How tall is the tallest person in your family?</p>
