Using the features of a play script in the beginning of an example interview

Speaker underlined with stage directions in brackets finish with a colon

Introduction based on a news programme

Newscaster (formally): Thank you Mr Dimbleby for that illuminating review of today's headlines. We now turn to our Home Correspondent David Thomas who has been talking to victims of the Nazi Holocaust. Welcome David. This morning, I understand that you met several young people, who came to Britain before the war on the kinder transport trains.

David Thomas (animatedly): Good morning Jim. Indeed I did and it proved to be a sobering experience reflecting the dreadful experiences of these families. I went to meet Harry this morning and recorded our conversation.

Switching on the recording

David Thomas (in a more serious tone of voice): Good morning Harry. Thank you so much for coming in to talk to us today. I know that our listeners will be highly interested in what you have to say.

Harry (in a slight German accent): Good morning David. I am very pleased to be here.

David (rustling a sheet of paper): Well Harry, perhaps you could tell a little about your early life before Herr Hitler came to power?

Harry: Of course David. Well, I was born into a middle-class Jewish family in Vienna in 1925. My father owned a clothing shop. I was an energetic child and particularly loved skating. The rivers and ponds all froze over in the winter and I spent every hour possible with my sister Gerta out on our skates. It was like heaven and I never dreamed that it would all come crashing around our ears.

David (curiously): What happened Harry?

Do not use inverted commas (speech marks) for dialogue in a play script

Use information from the website in Harry's answers

Fact families

Write down the fact families for these calculations

(a) $20 \times 6 =$

(b) $300 \div 5 =$

Multiplication facts

You can use this trick to help you to solve larger multiplication calculations such as 24×5

You know that $6 \times 4 = 24$ so, to solve 24×5 , you can do 6×5 and then multiply the answer by 4.

How might you solve 15×6 without doing a formal written calculation?

Written short division

Remember how you can solve division calculations using a formal written method

$$\begin{array}{r} 13 \\ 6 \overline{) 78} \end{array}$$

First divide 7 by 6 and write the answer 1 above the line – there is 1 left over so write this next to the 8 to make 18 then divide 18 by 6. Write the answer 3 above the line. Make sure that you line the numbers up.

Written short division

$$\begin{array}{r} 33 \text{ remainder } 3 \\ 4 \overline{) 135} \end{array}$$

1 divided by 4 does not give a whole number answer so divide 13 by 4, which equals 3 with 1 left over – put the 1 with the 5 to make 15 and divide it by 4. Write the answer above the line. There will be 3 left over so write this as a remainder.

Written short division

Use written short division to solve these calculations

(a) $143 \div 2 =$

(b) $122 \div 9 =$

(c) $369 \div 5 =$

(d) $184 \div 8 =$

(e) $226 \div 3 =$

(f) $4585 \div 3 =$

(g) $2843 \div 6 =$

(h) $6123 \div 8 =$
