



ISPACE openers

This week, we are going to be revising ISPACE openers – you will remember them from previous years – and using them in our own sentences.

Conjunctions join or connect different clauses in a sentence. There are two sorts of conjunction

1) Co-ordinating conjunctions, which can be remembered by FANBOYS, are

FOR AND NOR BUT OR YET SO

These co-ordinating conjunctions join two main clauses and do not need a comma.

For example

The small boy jumped up and managed to knock the biscuit tin off the shelf.

You can choose to read or you could do some Maths.

2) Subordinating conjunctions are much more numerous but here are some examples

IF SINCE ALTHOUGH WHILE WHEN BECAUSE BEFORE ONCE AFTER

For example

Rhys continued to play football although his shirt was soaked.

After tea had finished, the children went out to play.

You will notice that the subordinating conjunctions and subordinate clauses can be moved around the sentence and still make sense.

Features of a diary

A diary needs to include these features:

- ❖ A date
- ❖ An introductory section to 'set the scene'
- ❖ Different paragraphs in chronological order
- ❖ Written in the first person – I, we
- ❖ Written in the past tense
- ❖ ISPACE openers
- ❖ Events, reactions and opinions about what has happened
